

Health4Life Challenge 2008 Terms and Conditions

By registering to participate in the Health4Life Challenge, each participant/s – as nominated on the online *Registration Form* – agrees to be bound by the following terms and conditions (which may be amended from time to time):

1. Interpretation

1.1. The Griffith Health4Life Challenge

The Health4Life Challenge is an initiative of Griffith University.

1.2. Judges

All online registrations will be reviewed to ensure they meet the stated criteria. Supervising teachers will be notified by email of successful entries within one week of registering.

The Judges will be selected by Griffith University to be members of the Judging panel on the day of the Challenge. The role of the Judges will be to assess the oral presentations (Individual/Group digital project presentations and School Project proposal presentations).

Judge(s) will also be selected to assess all student posters on the day of the Challenge.

1.3. Defined Terms

Any terms defined in the entry *Guidelines* have the same meaning as in the *Terms and Conditions* of entry.

2. Entry

2.1 Mode of Entry

To enter the Griffith Health4Life Challenge, all participants must submit an online *Registration Form*.

Students must print a copy of their online registration form once completed. This form is to be mailed with the accompanying CD/DVD entry. Please Note, all registration forms and accompanying materials (entries) remain the property of Griffith University.

2.2 Correspondence

Any correspondence relating to the Health4Life Challenge will be directed by email or other such means to the Supervising Teacher (Primary Contact Person for entry/s) – as listed on the online Registration Form.

2.4. Eligibility

Participants must comply with the following requirements to be eligible for entry into, and continued participation in the Health4Life Challenge:

- a. Supervising Teacher must be nominated on the Registration Form as they will be the primary contact for entries.
- b. Entry participants must be enrolled in a secondary school (Year 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 students only).
- c. Groups must consist of at least two and not greater than four people for the Year Level group categories.
- d. A Competitor may not enter in more than one Year Level Group category.
- e. School Project Proposals must relate to a new school project proposal or an extension of a current health focused project within the school and must be approved and signed by the principal of the school. Students must complete a *School Project Proposal Cover sheet*.

2.5. Changes to Group Composition

- a. In Year Level Group or School Prize category - You can remove or appoint members of your group up until the deadline for sending digital projects by Friday 15 August 2008.
- b. Your proposal to remove or appoint a group member must be communicated via telephone or email, in order to be effective no later than one week prior to the Challenge.

2.6. Withdrawal of a Team

A team may withdraw from the Health4Life Challenge at any time, providing notice is addressed in writing (email) by the Supervising Teacher prior to 15 August 2008.

2.7. Originality

The concept that forms the basis of your group project topic must originate from yourself or one or more of the members of your group.

2.8. Media Exposure

It is a condition of entry that participants of the Health4Life Challenge will make themselves available to Griffith University's External Relations department, for media and public relations activities. Confidentiality will be maintained. All participants must complete a *Student Media Consent Form*.

2.9. Dress Code

It is a condition for all students participating in the Health4Life Challenge to wear their school uniform; however permission must be acquired from the relevant school.

3. Prizes and Decisions

3.1. First Prize – Individual Year Level Category

The Individual entry that is determined by the Judges to finish in first place will receive \$500. There will be one winner per year level group.

3.2. First Prize - Group Year Level Category

The Group entry that is determined by the Judges to finish in first place will receive \$500. There will be one Group winner per year level group. Prize money is to be divided equally between group members.

3.3. School Prize – School Project Proposal

School Prize is valued at \$5, 000 and will be awarded to the most creative school project proposal based on a new/improved health initiative and is to be used for the implementation of the project into the school. Students can enter this category individually or in groups no larger than 4 members. All school project proposals require the Principal's approval prior to submission.

3.4 Poster Prize

The Poster Prize is valued at \$250 and will be awarded to the poster which portrays high impact and the most creative visual interpretation of topic.

3.5. Date and notification of decision

The names of the teams to receive a prize under clauses 3.1, 3.2, 3.3 and 3.4 will be announced at the Health4Life Challenge on Saturday 23 August 2008.

3.6. Finality of decision

The decisions of the Judges will be final. No communication will be entered into with any person in relation to any decision of the Judges.

4. General

4.1. Changes to Terms and Conditions

Griffith University may change these Terms and Conditions at any time, without specific notice to you. The amended Terms and Conditions will be effective immediately upon being posted on the Health4Life Challenge website.

4.2. Taxes

You will be responsible for any taxes, duties, charges or levies to be paid to any person in connection with any money (including any prizes) you receive from the Health4Life Challenge.

4.3. Termination

Griffith University may at any time and for any reason:

- a. Disqualify entries from the Health4Life Challenge, in its absolute discretion, determines that such disqualification is warranted; or
- b. Discontinue the Health4Life Challenge and associated events by posting a notice to that effect on the Health4Life Challenge website.

4.4. Situations not covered by these Terms and conditions

Griffith University reserves the right to determine any situations not covered by these Terms and Conditions on a case-by-case basis. The decision will be final, and no communication will be entered into.
