Eligibility

To be eligible for admission to the Master Higher Education program, you are required to hold an honours degree with a minimum grade of 2B or equivalent. In addition, English language requirements apply to international applicants and applicants whose previous study was undertaken in a language other than English. Fees

As a research higher degree, tuition fees are not charged to Australian citizens or permanent residents. Fees do apply for international students. Fees for international students are currently \$17,600 p.a. This is for a mandatory full-time enrolment. Fees may change without notice. Fees quoted here accurate at 10/1/2011.

For Griffith academics a bursary may be paid to the school for teaching relief. Payment is dependent on satisfactory progress being made.

Introduction

The Master of Higher Education is a **research** masters. It is awarded on the basis of a thesis, prepared under supervision, which presents the results of original research in a scholarly form and demonstrates the candidate's knowledge of the research topic and the disciplines it embraces as judged by independent experts applying accepted contemporary international standards.

Program overview

The program comprises completion of a single research thesis (approx 30,000 to 40,000 words) under supervision of a GIHE academic.

GIHE academics have expertise in a range of areas of relevance to policy and practice in higher education. These include: assessment; the changing student experience; the first year experience; internationalisation; use of technologies in learning and teaching; work-integrated learning; research-based learning; problem-based learning; curriculum design issues across disciplines; and approaches to evaluation in higher education.
