An exciting opportunity is available for an outstanding student to work fulltime on an ARC Discovery Project assessing developmental pathways to intimate partner homicide. The position is located within the Key Centre for Ethics, Law, Justice and Governance at Griffith University, Mt Gravatt Campus, Brisbane. The findings from the project will extend understanding of the pathways and circumstances leading to partner homicide and contribute to improved decision-making models for police and social welfare agencies. The PhD project offers candidates an opportunity to develop their own area of expertise within the scope of the larger project.

- Excellent research support will be provided for the successful applicant, who is expected to have an honours degree (minimum 2A) or equivalent in psychology, education, sociology, public health, criminology or another relevant discipline.
- Strong quantitative and/or qualitative skills are required, as well as communication and organisational skills.
- Applicants must be Australian citizens or permanent residents.
