

Health4Life Challenge 2008 Guidelines

These Guidelines must be read subject to the *Terms and Conditions* of entry into the Health4Life Challenge. Any terms defined in the Terms and Conditions have the same meaning in these Guidelines.

Summary of the Health4Life Challenge

Participants who enter the Health4Life Challenge competition will broadly follow this process by visiting the [Health4Life website](#):

1. Complete an *online registration form* and print a copy
2. Entries are then reviewed to ensure they meet stated criteria.
3. Supervising teachers will be notified via email of successful entries within a week of registering.
4. Digital projects and presentations are to be prepared using appropriate software.
5. A completed copy of the project is to be burnt to a CD/DVD.
6. A copy of the project (CD/DVD), copy of online registration and a signed *Student Media Consent Form* is to be posted to the above address by **Wednesday 20 August**.
7. Participants will be notified by email of the presentation time and venue.

Individual and Group Year Level Category

Before registering, teams should ensure that they have read and understood the entry *Terms and Conditions*, and also the entry *Guidelines* of the competition.

Entries in the Health4Life Challenge are categorised as individual or group (maximum of four students to a group) from *Year 8 to Year 12, inclusive*.

Projects are to be submitted on a CD/DVD and clearly labelled with project title, student name/s, year level and school.

To enter the Health4Life Challenge, an *online Registration Form* must be completed. A Registration copy must be printed and posted along with the *Student Media Consent Form* and CD/DVD of entry, by **Wednesday 20 August 2008**.

A team of three Judges will assess the student projects on the day. Judging will be based on the quality of the presentation and on oral responses to Judges' questions.

Please Note: Presentations must not exceed 10 minutes followed by up to 5 minutes of question time from Judges.

Projects must be exported as TIF, JPG, EPS, PDF, PIC, BMP, MAX, 3DS, DXF or DWG files and in RGN at 72 dpi, but if possible at a higher resolution (eg 150 dpi).

Please ensure a copy of the project CD/DVD is brought on the day.

Judge's Evaluation Criteria (Year Level Individual and Group Prize Categories)

Unique and innovative project topic (5 marks)
Evidence of both lateral and focused research (5 marks)
Originality of work (5 marks)
Impact and depth of the presentation (5 marks)
Reference to positive outcomes for the future (5 marks)

Poster Category

All participants are required to design a poster to accompany their presentation. The Poster must be no larger than A2 size. There will be an area allocated for all posters to be displayed and each poster will be judged based on the following criteria.

Judge's Evaluation Criteria (Poster Prize Category)

Impact of theme (5 marks)
Visual translation of theme (5 marks)
Originality of work (5 marks)
Use of text (5 marks)
Overall Impact and depth of the visual presentation (5 marks)

School Prize Category - School Project Proposal

A School Prize will be awarded to the most creative and innovative school project proposal based on a new/improved health initiative. Project proposals can be entered by an Individual or a group of students (max 4 per group). School Project Proposals must follow the *Report Format* and include A *School Project Proposal Cover sheet* with each School Prize category entry. Please ensure all entries have the Principal's approval prior to submitting application.

Digital Projects are to be submitted on a CD/DVD and clearly labelled with project title, student name/s, year level and school.

To enter the Health4Life Challenge, an *online Registration Form* must be completed. A Registration copy must be printed and posted along with the *Student Media Consent Form*, CD/DVD of entry and School Project Proposal by **Wednesday 20 August 2008**.

The winning School project proposal will receive a \$5,000 prize to go towards the implementation of the project.

Please Note: Presentations must not exceed 10 minutes followed by up to 5 minutes of question time from Judges.

Unique and innovative project topic (5 marks)
Evidence of both lateral and focused research (5 marks)
Originality of work (5 marks)
Impact and depth of the presentation (5 marks)
Reference to positive outcomes for the future (5 marks)
