Welcome to Queensland Conservatorium.

When you choose to study music that's a pretty important decision and there's a number of things you need to consider.

First of all you need to have excellent teachers with great experience in an environment that works for you. At Queensland Conservatorium we've got a broad range of programs from Western classical music to jazz; to popular music to musical theatre and opera, and teachers that have been teaching all over the world and training some of the best musicians in the scene today. In addition to that we've shaped our curriculum to both capture the great traditions but also to prepare you for life as a musician in the 21st Century.

A second aspect that's very important is your musical environment. At Queensland Conservatorium we're both a tertiary institution and a concert venue. We have over 200 concerts and events every year and in addition to that we're at the heart of the cultural precinct of Brisbane with the orchestra right next door; ABC radio; the Performing Art's Centre is just next to it and then the Museum's just a little bit further away. Griffith also has its Film School and the College of Arts just down the road. So the intensity of the cultural experience is enormous.

Finally, and very importantly, you need to find like minded people around you. At Queensland Conservatorium we have over 800 undergraduate students studying this whole range of programs and about 80 students in post-graduate programs, like research programs. That means that you're there with people that just are beginning to develop the art and people that are really at the peak of their game already.
