

Introduction

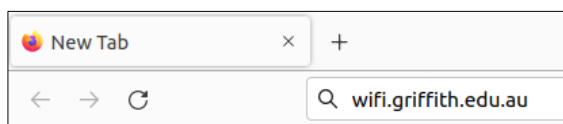
This guide will show you how to connect to Griffith University Wi-Fi on a Linux device.

Before you start - The onboarding process requires an active internet connection. If you are on campus and require temporary access, connect to the **Setup Griffith WiFi* SSID.

Screenshots in this guide may differ depending on device and software versions.

Part A: Download and set up SecureW2 JoinNow

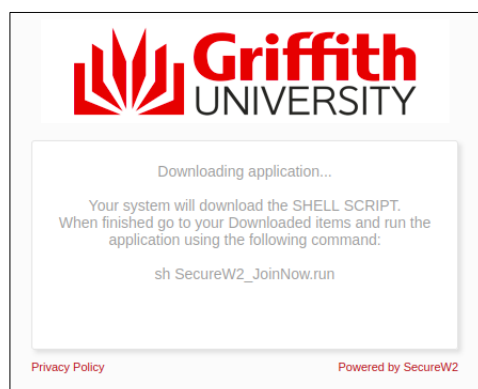
- 1 Open a web browser and go to **wifi.griffith.edu.au**.



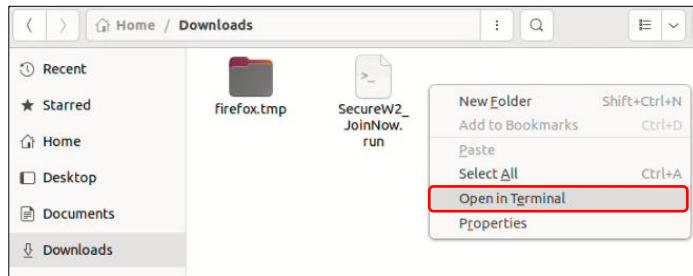
- 2 Check **Select your device** is set to **Linux** then click **JoinNow**.



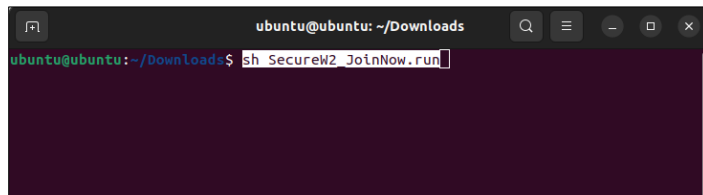
- 3 The **SecureW2_JoinNow.run** file will download to your device.



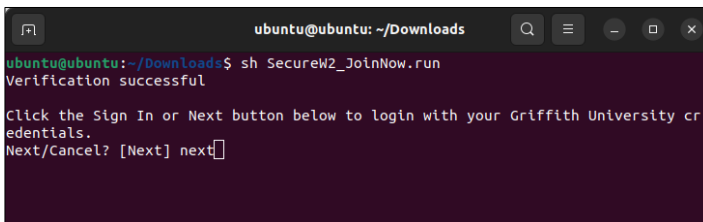
- 4 Open the **Downloads** folder on your device. Right-click anywhere in the folder and select **Open in Terminal**.



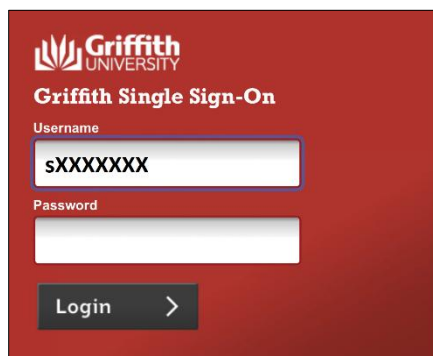
- 5 In the Terminal window enter **sh SecureW2_JoinNow.run**



- 6 At the below prompt enter **Next**.

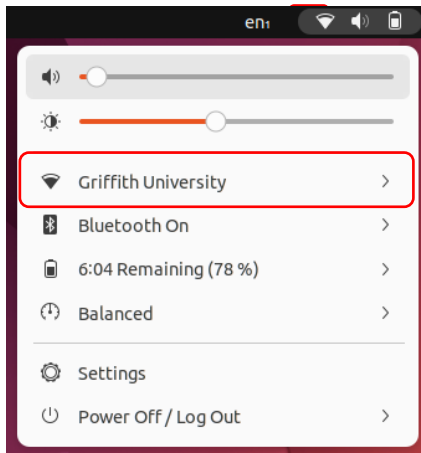


- 7 Sign in using your **Griffith sNumber** and **Griffith password** (e.g. sXXXXXXXX).



Part C: Test your Wi-Fi connection

- 1 Open the **Wi-Fi menu** on your desktop and check your device is now connected to the **Griffith University** Wi-Fi network (it may take up to one minute for the network to appear).



- 2 Once connected, try browsing the internet to check your connection to Griffith University Wi-Fi is working correctly.
