David Close D.Phil.
State Secretary, Queensland Rhodes Scholarship

David was a Rhodes Scholar from Tasmania, elected in 2000. He undertook a D.Phil. in marine geology and geophysics at the school of earth sciences in Oxford between 2001 and 2005. He has spent the majority of his post-graduate career in the private sector in upstream oil and gas. He is an adjunct at the UQ Gas & Energy Transition Research Centre.

Caitlin Goss was a Rhodes Scholar from Queensland, elected in 2009. At Oxford she completed a Bachelor of Civil Law (Dist.) and a D.Phil in Law. She has worked as a judge's associate, and as a lawyer in Queensland and in the Office of the Co-Prosecutors in the Extraordinary Chambers of the Courts of Cambodia. She is a Senior Lecturer at the University of Queensland and researches and teaches in international law and comparative constitutional law.

What is the Rhodes Scholarship?

- The Rhodes Scholarships were established in terms of the Will of Cecil John Rhodes in 1902 and over a hundred years later, it is the oldest and perhaps the most prestigious postgraduate scholarship in the world
- It is a merit-based scholarship, with the purpose of developing public-spirited leaders, and to promote international understanding and peace through an international community of Scholars.
- Rhodes Scholars study full-time postgraduate courses offered by Oxford University and spend two or more years in the UK.
- There are 9 Scholarships awarded each year in Australia



What is covered by the Rhodes Scholarship?

- All Oxford course fees (ranging from \$70,000 to \$120,000 per annum)
- An annual stipend (approx. \$40,000 per annum)
- The costs of applying to study at Oxford
- Health cover while in Oxford
- Economy class flights to and from the UK at the start and end of the Scholarship
- A settling in allowance paid on arrival in Oxford
- Note that the scholarship cannot be deferred and cannot be held with another scholarship.

What makes the Rhodes Scholarship Unique?



- The Scholarship is linked exclusively to Oxford.
- You will have access to Rhodes House and support of the Warden and staff
- Your cohort will include
 - 8 other Australian Rhodes Scholars
 - about 100 Rhodes Scholars from all over the world
- You will interact with over 200 Rhodes Scholars in residence at any one time
- You will become part of a community of 8000 Rhodes Scholars worldwide

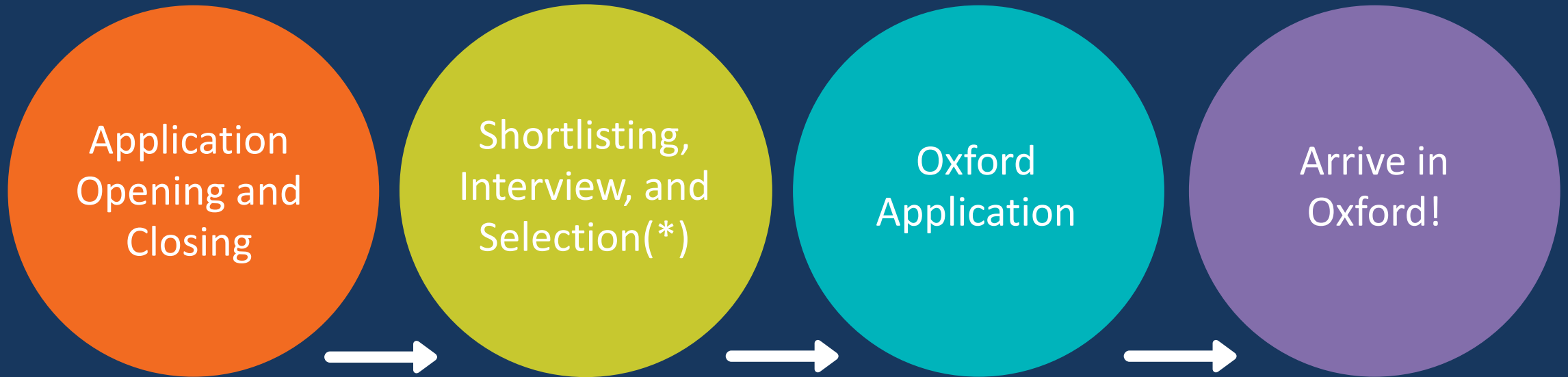

About the New Colombo Plan

What is the New Colombo Plan?

- The New Colombo Plan (NCP) is an Australian Government initiative that provides opportunities for Australian undergraduate university students to develop their Indo-Pacific capability and Asia literacy through immersive, structured learning and internships in the Indo-Pacific region.
- The program fosters deeper people-to-people and education relationships, and increases Australia's economic engagement with the region by supporting NCP participants to build job-ready skills, and supporting NCP alumni to maintain their ties to the Indo-Pacific.

About the New Colombo Plan

Reforms to the NCP

- In July 2025, Minister for Foreign Affairs Senator the Hon Penny Wong, announced the next phase of the NCP, which will further strengthen Australia's Indo-Pacific capability and Asia literacy. From 2026, the NCP will further increase scholarship numbers, place greater emphasis on students learning Asian languages and prioritise long-term experiences.
- This next phase will focus on ensuring recipients develop the skills and capabilities Australia needs to deepen our national understanding of the region, strengthen the ties between our people, and increase engagement with Australian businesses operating in the region. Key elements of the reforms include:
 - increasing the number of scholarships to 500 per year by 2028
 - introducing a new NCP Semester Program to encourage students to take longer experiences in the region
 - creating a language learning target across the program to boost the learning of priority Asian languages
 - increasing engagement with Australia's transnational education presence in the Indo-Pacific
 - strengthening business engagement by providing stronger private sector links and employment pathways for NCP students

New Colombo Plan

NCP Scholarship Program

The NCP Scholarship Program supports Australian undergraduate students to strengthen their Indo-Pacific capability and Asia literacy including through study, language learning and internships, with programs up to 19 months.

Stage	Scholarship Program
Nomination	Universities nominate eligible students.
Application	Students apply; shortlisted applicants are interviewed.
Preparation	Awarded scholars undertake online training before departure.
Program	Complete Scholarship in host location.
Alumni	Participants who successfully complete their programs are invited to join the NCP Alumni cohort.

Minimum eligibility requirements

You're eligible for a John Monash Scholarship if you:

1. Are an Australian citizen
2. Have completed (or will complete by the end of this year) an undergraduate degree at an Australian university
3. Plan to undertake a full-time master's or PhD at an overseas university in 2027

You're not eligible if you:

- Are already completing postgraduate study or plan to start a program in 2026
- Plan to study at an Australian university
- Already hold a Rhodes, Fulbright or Ramsay scholarship for the same program

Choosing a program

The John Monash Scholarship provides an annual stipend of \$AU100,000 for the duration of one program for up to three years:

- 1-year full-time master's degree receives \$100,000
- 2-year full-time master's degree receives \$200,000
- 3-year full-time PhD/DPhil receives \$300,000

Your application should justify how your chosen program:

- is the best fit for your future career
- advances progress in your field
- will help contribute to your area of study, and impact Australia more broadly.

You do not need to apply or have an offer before submitting your application.

You should, however, check the admission requirements of your program and understand your eligibility.





Making an online application

To apply for the John Monash Scholarship, you will need to submit the following documents:

- Resume
- Official academic transcripts from your degree(s) at an Australian university, complete or incomplete
- Three Letters of Recommendation from academic, professional or personal referees
- Budget plan showing how you will manage your finances abroad (a template will be provided)

Questions in the application form will cover these themes:

- Professional experience
- Leadership, engagement and impact
- Your proposal for your selected university and program
- Your proposed future contribution to Australia



Application tips

Read carefully

The application instructions, application questions and help text, as well as the information on our website.

Seek guidance

Mentors, university prestigious scholarship teams, and academics.

Do your research

Why have you chosen your proposed university? Is it the best for your field of study? Is it in proximity to locations/ research/other experts who would enhance your study experience, or are not available in Australia?

Choose your referees carefully

They should be the most senior people who can speak to your excellence and leadership capabilities. Select the most appropriate combination of academic/professional/personal referees based on your career stage. We do not recommend submitting only personal references.

Be authentic

Be honest and genuine in your responses and allow your personality and lived experience to shine through.

Allow plenty of time

Note the strict closing deadline, ensure your referees are prepared and complete their part promptly. Late applications cannot be accepted.

Draft and proofread before you submit!

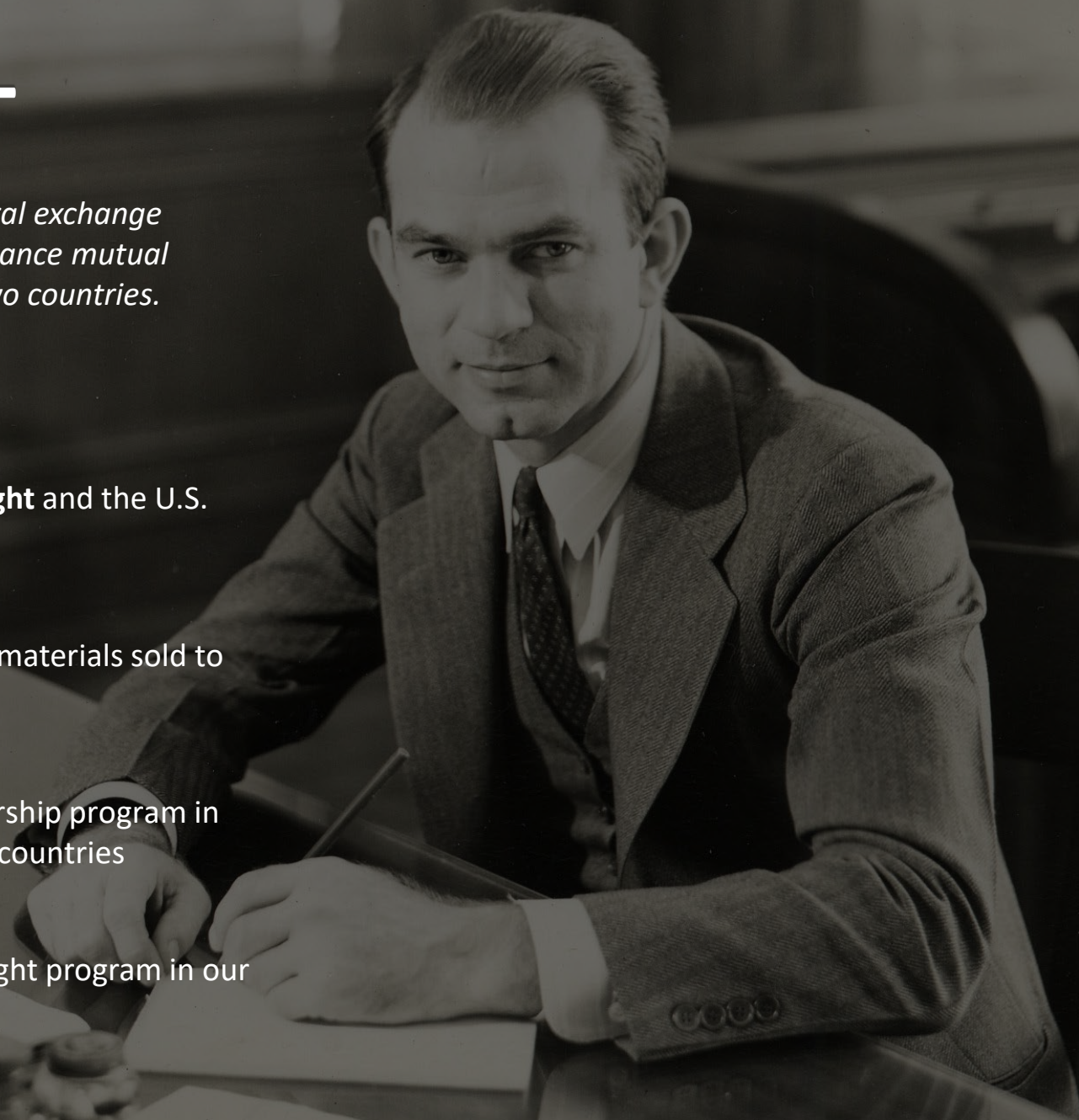


ABOUT FULBRIGHT

The Fulbright Program promotes educational and cultural exchange between Australia and the United States in order to enhance mutual understanding and strengthen relations between the two countries.

Our History

- Established in 1946 by U.S. Senator **J. William Fulbright** and the U.S. Government
- Ethos of ‘**swords into ploughshares**’ – surplus WWII materials sold to fund two-way academic exchanges to/from the U.S.
- Has grown to become the largest educational scholarship program in the world, operating between the U.S. and over 150 countries
- Over 6,000 alumni of the Australian-American Fulbright program in our 75-year history



Fulbright Scholarship Benefits

Scholarships are valued between **\$30,000 - \$200,000** (depending on category, award length, and tuition costs where applicable) and include the following:

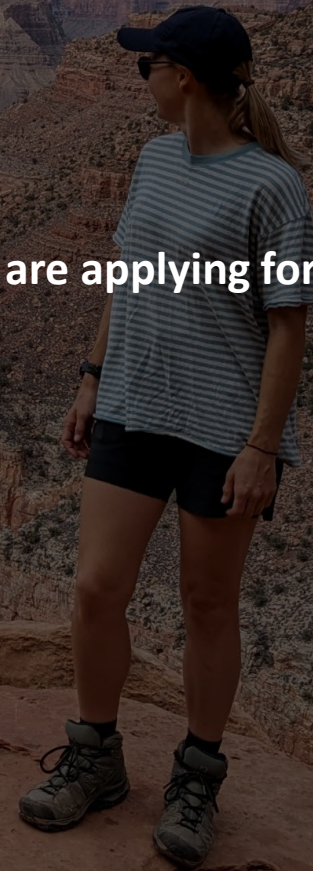

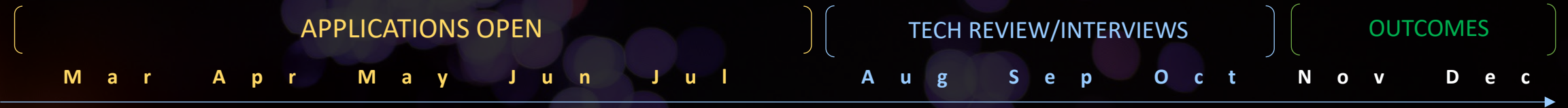


Application Components

- Project proposal (study/research objectives) – written for general audience
- Personal statement
- 2 (minimum) to 3 (recommended) confidential referee reports required -- completed online
- Host institution letter of invitation (not required at postgraduate coursework level)
- Copies of official, complete academic transcripts (where applicable)
- Checklist (available on application page) to identify which award/s you are applying for
- Impact statement (where applicable)



Application Timeline



- Applications are open from **March to July** each year
- Selected applicants will be invited for interview between August-October
- All applicants will receive notification of the outcome of their application by the end of the year
