

“Love is Blind” – Helping Bethel China

On 15th October, a charity event was held by the Griffith Asia Institute (GAI) and the Tourism Confucius Institute (TCI) at Griffith University in Brisbane. The goal of this activity was to raise funds for blind orphans in the care of [Bethel China](#), a pioneer and leader in the field of early intervention for blind children in China.

In the early morning volunteers from the GAI and TCI arrived on site. Passers-by were attracted by beautiful Chinese knots, firework decorations and eye-catching brush pens, ink, paper and ink stones. Volunteers from the GAI explained how Bethel China functions and the situation of blind orphans cared for by Bethel China. Volunteers from the TCI wrote elegant and meaningful Chinese names for donors. Individuals donated generously to the blind children with the hope of enlightening their lives.



The activity was brought to a successful close at noon. All the donated money was handed to the Bethel China Charity Organization by staff from Griffith University's "2016 Asia Future Fellows" whom are sponsoring more than 70 children.
