

Griffith University Sports Hall of Fame Selection Criteria

Membership will be divided into two categories:

- Athlete members
 High performance athletes that have excelled in their chosen sport
- General members
 Those that have demonstrated excellence in support roles or research for high performance sport/athletes e.g. coaches, administrators, officials, sport scientists, researchers, volunteers etc

A sport will be defined as one that is funded by Sport Australia or a non-funded sport that is in the Olympic, Paralympic or Commonwealth Games.

Candidates for the Griffith Sports Hall of Fame will be considered annually via a nomination process and any inductees presented at the Griffith Sports Excellence Blues Awards.

The Hall of Fame Committee will be the arbiter in respect to the selection or otherwise of any Nominee. The Committee will also be the arbiter should a membership to the Hall of Fame be revoked at a later time due to the member no longer meeting the criteria.

Athlete Members

- 1. Nominees must:
 - a) be a Griffith University graduate
 - b) be recognised as a superior athlete at the highest level of their sport (relevant to that sport)
 or have made an exceptional contribution over an extended period of time to their sport at a
 very high level
- 2. To be considered as an elite athlete as described above 1.(b), you must be defined as an elite relative to your time of competition and as described in Griffith University's Elite Athlete Support Policy.
- 3. Athlete nominees will not be considered for induction until at least 4 years after their graduation or 4 years after their retirement from their sport.
- 4. In addition to their achievements within sport, the nominee's personal integrity, sportsmanship and character will be considered in the selection process.

Note individual and team athletes will be considered equally. The committee will take into account the level of achievement within the respective sport and the degree of difficulty to reach that level.



Sports College

General Members

- 1. Nominees must:
 - a. be a Griffith University graduate, or have had a long association with Griffith University in another capacity e.g. Employment
 - b. have significantly and positively impacted high performance sport and/or highperformance athletes in their capacity as a coach, official, sports administrator, researcher, sport scientist, volunteer or similar
 - demonstrate that the impact on high performance sport by the nominee be either sustained over a long period of time and/or result in a world class performance in sport
 - d. have the support of their peers
- 2. In addition to their achievements within and supporting high performance sport/athletes, the nominee's personal integrity, sportsmanship and character will be considered in the selection process.
