As many of you will have heard this morning, the Prime Minister has announced cancellations of all non-essential indoor gatherings of over 100 people.

In today's announcement, the Prime Minister clarified the ban does not include universities, as well as schools, child-care, airports, public transport, medical and emergency services facilities, aged care homes, courts, parliaments, supermarkets and many workplaces.

The University has decided, out of an abundance of caution, **to suspend all classes with over 100 people from Thursday**. The University is transitioning these classes to remote/online learning, wherever possible. Where this is not possible, we will communicate with these students directly.

For the time being, library, food outlets and child-care services remain open on our campuses.

Non-core teaching, learning and research events of more than 20 people should be cancelled or postponed. Any events that are continuing need to take into consideration social distancing practices. Consideration should be given to the choice of venues to accommodate these social distancing requirements.

Thank you for your understanding. We will continue to communicate with students and staff as we work through this exceptional circumstance.
