INFORMATION SHEET

Overview - The type of scholarship funding that an organisation may provide to a HDR candidate, and the research activities associated with the funding agreement come in various forms.

However, generally the establishment of all external funding arrangements will comprise the following **characteristics**:

- The externally funded research project is appropriate for completion as a Doctoral degree.
- The candidate's ability to submit their thesis in a timely manner will not be adversely impacted by the conditions of the externally funded scholarship.
- The externally funded research project must meet RTP funding criteria:
 - The candidate must spend at least 60 days full-time or equivalent undertaking research activities with the organisation (either in-person or remotely).
 - The research collaboration must be agreed to in written form by the candidate, the University and industry partner within 18 months of commencement for full-time candidates, or 36 months for part-time candidates.

- Where the candidate is to undertake research activities collaboratively with the organisation:
 - The candidate will be appropriately supported and monitored by Griffith supervisors for the duration of the program, and normally an industry supervisor will be appointed to the supervisory team.
 - The organisation will have access to Griffith research infrastructure and facilities to conduct the research project.
 - The responsibilities and mutual expectations of the candidate, Griffith supervisor/s, and the organisation will be clearly articulated and agreed.

NATIONAL INDUSTRY PHD PROGRAM SELECTION CRITERIA

This program is designed to support existing University/Industry relationships and places increased value on the quality of the relationship. The criteria used to measure each project is as follows:

- Engagement between University & Industry Partner (50%)
- Research feasibility and strategic alignment (30%)
- Project impact (10%)
- Capacity, capability, and resource to support the development of PhD Candidates (10%)

INDUSTRY PHD CO-FUNDED SCHOLARSHIP REQUESTS

Framework - The Industry PhD Scholarship stream provides a framework for the consideration of Industry-University co-funding arrangements. Where Griffith University funding is requested the criteria outlined below will apply. The research project arrangement must also meet the Governments new Research Training Program (RTP) doctoral Internship completions funding weighting criteria (refer adjacent section) for Griffith co-funding requests to be considered.

RTP funding criteria- for a candidate awarded an externally funded scholarship to be eligible for the [RTP Doctoral internship funding weighting](#) upon completion, the following characteristics must also be manifest:

- The agreement is with a [research end-user](#) organisation
- The agreement will be in place no later than 18 months FTE from commencement of the candidate's program.
- The candidate will spend at least 60 days FT or equivalent undertaking research activities with the organisation (either in person or remotely) at any point during candidature.

External organisation primary stipend financial contributor -

Where the external organisation is the primary stipend financial contributor, a request for Griffith co-funding may include a top up scholarship, or other funding incentive. A full or partial Griffith funded tuition scholarship for potential international applicants may also be requested. It is expected that the external organisation will be the primary financial contributor (normally a full stipend scholarship) where one or more of the following applies:

- The candidate is to undertake a collaborative or embedded research project, where the project seeks to address an industry problem and there is an expectation of key deliverables for the organisation.
- The external organisation is seeking to own all research project Intellectual Property.
- The candidate is to meet the admission eligibility requirements only (i.e. H2A standard)
- Flexible attendance options are to be offered to the candidate (i.e. may be enrolled on a full-time or part-time basis.)
- The external organisation will be supporting its employees (Industry professionals) to undertake PhD projects in partnership with the University. (In lieu of a scholarship, the organisation may continue to pay the candidate's salary.)
- The University already has an arrangement in place with the external organisation to provide defined support where a full stipend scholarship is provided (i.e. Griffith provision of access to specific resources or expertise to the organisation, funding for research project expenses etc.)

Griffith University primary stipend financial contributor – A

request for a full or partial Griffith University stipend scholarship co-funding arrangement will only be considered where all of the following applies:

- The organisation is providing a partial or top-up stipend scholarship (of at least \$10,000 or more pa for 3+ years for a top-up scholarship).
- The candidate will own the intellectual property they create, which is directly related to their research project.
- The candidate is to meet the Griffith scholarship eligibility requirements (i.e. H1 standard).
- The candidate is to be enrolled on a full-time basis.
- The candidate is to be based on-campus, or enrolled as a remote candidate within Australia.
- The funding request is supported by the Dean (Research).
- The funding request can be serviced within the available scholarship budget. **(Preference for establishment of co-funding arrangements will be given to requests for partial GU scholarships over requests for a full stipend scholarship.)**

Where an arrangement does not meet the criteria for Griffith – University co-funding consideration, candidates will be able to apply and be competitively considered for Griffith scholarship/s in the open merit Continuous Scholarship Round.
