### 5.0 ELIGIBILITY FOR PRIZE

5.1 The prize is open to Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University classical violin students enrolled in the first or second year of an undergraduate programme or alternatively a final year Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University classical violin student who will be doing a postgraduate programme at the Queensland Conservatorium with classical violin as their Performance Study the following year.

### 6.0 SELECTION PROCESS

6.1 Competitors are required to play two contrasting works of their own choice, lasting not longer than 10 minutes in duration.

6.2 Previous winners of the prize are not eligible to enter

6.3 Judges are to be appointed by the Director (or their nominee)

6.4 No judge may be the teacher of a competitor in this competition.

### 7.0 ADMINISTRATION OF THE PRIZE

7.1 The Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University will be responsible for the administration of the prize, including the publicising of the prize and managing funds associated with the prize.
