EMOTIONAL UPRISING

Boost your emotional intelligence! This session is all about understanding and enhancing emotional intelligence, a crucial skill for leaders who want to connect and lead effectively.



IT'S A TEAM THING

Learn the art of teamwork! In this session, students will explore the complexities of managing teams and delve into group behaviour, gaining insights into what makes teams work well together.



INSTRUMENT OF INFLUENCE

Unlock the power of influence! This session encourages students to develop their moral imagination while critically evaluating the sources of power and various influence tactics used by leaders.

Pro Vice Chancellor Scholarships

Schools who participate in three GriffithBUSINESS activities are eligible to enter a pool of Pro Vice Chancellor (Business) scholarships valued at \$2,000.

A maximum of one scholarship per school will be awarded after the census date (March) 2026. Candidates will be chosen by their respective schools.

Programs of study

To be eligible, students may choose any single or double undergraduate degree offered by Griffith Business School. Students who opt for a double degree with another faculty are also eligible.

Selection criteria

Candidates will be chosen by their respective schools and ranked on the basis of outstanding performance in curriculum and extra-curricular-related activities.
