5.0 ELIGIBILITY FOR PRIZE

5.1 Awarded to a Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University student completing a Bachelor of Music Degree, majoring in Brass, judged to have performed the best two contrasting works in this public competition.

6.0 SELECTION PROCESS

- 6.1 The award of the Prizes shall be determined at a public competition to be held annually.
- 6.2 Judges will be appointed by the Director.
- 6.3 Each entrant is required to present a program of two contrasting works, not exceeding 15 minutes in total.
- 6.4 The cost of the accompanist will be borne by the entrant.
- 6.5 Previous winners are not eligible to apply.
- 6.6 No judge may be the teacher of a student who is competing.

7.0 ADMINISTRATION OF THE PRIZE

7.1 The Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University will be responsible for the administration of this Prize.
