Griffith offers a range of admission pathways to encourage and support students from various backgrounds.

How to apply

To apply for an undergraduate degree you must submit an application through the Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC) or the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC)*. If you have completed TAFE study you may be eligible to apply directly to Griffith.

To be eligible for an offer you need to meet subject prerequisites and achieve the minimum Selection Rank. Check the admission requirements specific to your preferred degree via the Degree and Career Finder.

Admission pathways

If you do not meet the admission requirements for your preferred undergraduate degree, you may wish to consider an admission pathway. These options can help you gain admission into your preferred undergraduate degree or to satisfy subject prerequisites:

- Bridging and enabling programs
- Griffith College, TAFE and VET pathways
- University study
- STAT (Special Tertiary Admissions Test)
- Employment experience

Educational Access Scheme

You can apply for EAS when you apply for an undergraduate degree through QTAC or UAC. EAS can help if you have experienced circumstances that negatively affected your studies. If eligible for EAS, you may receive an equity adjustment, which could improve your chances of receiving an offer.

Certificate IV in Adult Tertiary Preparation (CATP)

Successful completion of the Certificate IV in Adult Tertiary Preparation from TAFE Queensland is an excellent admission pathway into a range of Griffith degrees. You can also undertake specific modules to meet subject prerequisite requirements.

Griffith University Preparation Program (GUPP)

We deliver a tertiary enabling program at Logan campus for mature age applicants. This program provides a pathway for those who wish to undertake study at Griffith University but lack the formal qualifications required for admission into an undergraduate degree. Successful completion of this program meets the Griffith English subject prerequisite, and you will be eligible for admission into a range of Griffith undergraduate degrees.

Griffith College

Griffith College offers a foundation program that prepares you for university study and provides a seamless pathway to Griffith. You may wish to undertake specific modules to improve your area of study or to meet Griffith subject prerequisite requirements.

Griffith College also offers a range of university-level diplomas and associate degrees that provide a smooth transition into further degree study at Griffith University. Upon successful completion of a Griffith College diploma or associate degree, you will be eligible for direct admission into the next available intake of a related Griffith undergraduate degree, with credit transfer. Quotas may apply for some degrees.

TAFE Admission Pathways

The TAFE Admission Pathway awards graduates of a Diploma of Advanced Diploma completed at an Australian TAFE Institute with a competitive Selection Rank. Graduates can also apply for direct admission into the next available intake of most undergraduate degrees. Quotas may apply for some degrees. In partnership with TAFE Queensland, we also offer a range of dual diploma/Griffith degree qualifications.

VET Qualifications

Studying a VET Certificate III or IV, or a Diploma or Advanced Diploma at an approved VET provider may improve your chances of gaining admission into your preferred Griffith degree.

Single Course of Study at Griffith

Successfully completing a minimum of two single courses (subjects) of study can award you with a Selection Rank for admission into an undergraduate degree and meets the Griffith English subject prerequisite.

Upgrading via University Study

You can improve your Selection Rank by undertaking studies in an alternative Griffith degree. This pathway may also provide credit towards your preferred degree, reducing the time needed to complete your studies.

Employment Experience

To be considered for admission based on your experience, you must be 18 years of age prior to commencement of the trimester. Your employment experience does not have to be related to your preferred degree. Visit the website for further details including documentation required.

Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT)

The STAT is a two-hour multiple choice exam. If you are a non-current school-leaver who is 18 years of age or over, you can sit this exam and gain a Selection Rank for admission into most Griffith degrees. A high score in STAT may also meet the Griffith English subject prerequisite for some degrees.
