Direct Entry Program

Join our highly popular Direct Entry Program to gain the English skills necessary to enter a Griffith University degree or a program at Griffith College.

There are seven levels in the Direct Entry program and you will be placed in the appropriate class for you based on your proficiency test or your Griffith English Test result.

In our classes, you will use technology to access your learning materials and complete your class work.

In the Direct Entry Program, you will build your English language skills in Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking, and at the higher levels you will practise academic skills that will help you to be successful in your future studies.

When you successfully complete the Direct Entry Program at the equivalent of the IELTS level needed for your degree or diploma, you can enter your program directly without needing to submit a proficiency test result.*

General English

Our English courses are not just for people wanting to go to university. We know there is a variety of reasons you may want to improve your English. No matter whether you are beginner or advanced, you can enrol in our General English program to achieve your goals. You will receive all the benefits of studying on the Griffith University campus and have access to leading student support services and activities.

If you change your study preferences and decide that you would like to apply to Griffith University or Griffith College at a later date, you will already be on the pathway to undertake further study.

GELI classes

Class sizes at GELI are small so you will receive personal attention from your teachers and progress quickly through your studies.

There are 20 hours of study per week, plus an additional 5 hours of independent learning each week using GELI's independent learning plans. You will need a laptop with a camera and microphone to access learning resources and for some class activities.

Classes are held daily Monday to Friday in two 2-hour sessions with a break between the sessions.

PTE Academic Test Centre

Griffith's PTE Academic Test Centre is located on the Gold Coast campus. PTE Academic is a computer-based test of English language proficiency for study, migration and professional registration. Tests results are typically available within five business days.

Where to live

Whether you would like to live on-campus or off-campus, there are several options you can explore to find housing to suit your needs. Homestay is another great option and allows you to experience life with a local family and practise your English while you study.

Temporary and short stay accommodation

It is vitally important that you organise temporary accommodation for your first few days or weeks in Queensland, as it is important that you inspect your long-term off-campus accommodation before you move in. There are short-term accommodation options located near each of our campuses that are easily accessible by public transport.

Off-campus

In Australia, share housing—where you share a house or apartment with a number of other students—is the most common form of off-campus accommodation.

When looking for suitable off-campus accommodation, you will need to consider:

- the cost of rent (usually advertised as a weekly amount)
- if utilities are included in your rent (electricity, water, gas)
- · if internet is included in your rent
- if the accommodation is furnished
- how close the accommodation is to your campus
- · access to public transport

Off-campus accommodation preferred partners

Griffith University has established preferred partnerships with a selection of off-campus student accommodation providers across its campuses between Brisbane and the Gold Coast. To be included in this program, providers are inspected by University staff and are required to meet a set of performance standards that ensures quality and safety.

Homestay

Homestay accommodation gives you the option of living with an Australian family while you study. Homestay is available to students at all Griffith campuses. Some homestay providers offer independent living options such as a granny flat. Homestay is a great way to develop your English language skills and experience life in Australia, and offers catered and self-catered options. griffith.edu.au/homestay

On-campus

Griffith offers self-catered accommodation on the Nathan campus and partners with Campus Living Villages to provide self-catered, on-campus accommodation in the Griffith University Village on the Gold Coast campus.

Living on campus is a fantastic way to meet new people, find out about new cultures, and develop independence. On-campus accommodation is fully furnished and provides access to cooking facilities, laundry facilities, common rooms and internet, as well as offering a vibrant social life.

Airport pickup

International students commencing at GELI can apply for a free airport pickup, which takes you from the airport directly to your pre-arranged accommodation. The service is free for eligible new international students arriving at the Brisbane or Gold Coast airports.

Cost of living

There are many different costs involved in international study and your cost of living in Australia will vary depending on your lifestyle and personal requirements.

South East Queensland offers a combination of quality education and high living standards.

The cost of living in South East Queensland is considered more affordable than other major Australian cities such as Sydney and Melbourne*.

The Australian Government requires students to have access to a minimum of AUD \$24,505 (Australian dollars) per year to meet their living costs, but many students spend more than this. Costs will be higher if you have family members accompanying you.

* In the QS Best Student Cities 2023 rankings, Brisbane and the Gold Coast are ahead of Sydney and Melbourne in the Affordability Rank.

Calculating your total cost of study

Your total cost of studying in Australia will include:

- tuition fees
- visa application fees
- Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)
- flights
- cost of living
- other personal and study-related expenses.

Tuition fees

Tuition fees are reviewed annually, and international students should expect an increase in fees each year.

- provide information about Orientation;
- send you a series of emails with information to assist your transition to study at GELI.
