Set up Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) on your Windows device

Introduction

Griffith has introduced MFA to ensure the security of your information by adding an additional layer of authentication to your Single Sign-On. PingID is the MFA tool used by Griffith. This guide shows how to install and setup MFA on your Windows computer.

Set up MFA on your Windows computer

If you are already logged into a Griffith App or myGriffith using your browser, you will need to log out and log back in, starting the process from a new browser window.

Login to MyGriffith at https://my.griffith.edu.au using your Griffith credentials.




Griffith Single Sign-On

Select Start at the Welcome to Multi-Factor
Authentication window.



Select Desktop from Other Authentication Methods



Select PingID Download for Windows.



- If prompted 'Do you want to allow this app to make changes to your PC?', select **Yes**.
- Review the software license agreement, select I accept the agreement, then Next.

If you are prompted to **support roaming user profiles** > leave option unchecked > select **Next**.




- Paste the pairing key into the PingID window.
- Click Pair. Setup is now completed.

NOTE: Do not uninstall the PinglD App!

To use MFA you need to use the PinglD App each time you authenticate with MFA to access a Griffith App.
