



The Fulbright Program promotes educational and cultural exchange between Australia and the United States in order to enhance mutual understanding and strengthen relations between the two countries.

Our History

- Established in 1946 by U.S. Senator J. William Fulbright and the U.S. Government
- Ethos of 'swords into ploughshares' surplus WWII materials sold to fund two-way academic exchanges to/from the U.S.





RHODES SCHOLARSHIP

Emeritus Professor Stan Hurn State Secretary, Queensland Rhodes Scholarship B.Com. Hons., Cum Laude (Natal), M.Phil., D.Phil. (Oxon.)

Professor Stan Hurn joined QUT in 1998 as a Professor of Econometrics in the School of Economics and Finance. He obtained a MPhil and DPhil in Economics as a Rhodes Scholar at St. Edmund Hall, Oxford.

Prior to commencing at QUT, he held various positions at other institutions including: Official Fellow and University Lecturer in Economics at Brasenose College, Oxford; Visiting Senior Lecturer at The University of Melbourne; and Lecturer/Senior Lecturer the University of Glasgow.

Professor Hurn's main research interests are in the field of time-series econometrics, and he has published widely in this area. He is Fellow and a Member of the Governing Council of the Society for Financial Econometrics.

What is the Rhodes Scholarship?

The Rhodes Scholarship is a fully funded, full time, postgraduate award that enables talented young people from around the world, to study at the University of Oxford.

Rhodes Scholars go to the UK for two or more years and can apply to study any postgraduate course offered by Oxford University.

We encourage applications from talented students everywhere.

Applying for the Scholarship is a challenge, but it is an experience which has helped generations of young people to succeed.

What does the Rhodes Scholarship cover?

- The Rhodes Scholarship covers
 - Oxford University (and College) fees
 - An annual stipend
 - The costs of applying to study at Oxford
 - Health cover
 - Two economy class flights to and from the UK
 - A settling in allowance paid on arrival in Oxford
- Note that the scholarship cannot be deferred and cannot be held with another scholarship.



Are you eligible?

- You must be an Australian citizen or permanent resident. Applications from refugees/asylum seekers will also be accepted.
- You must have completed 2 years of schooling at an Australian secondary school
- You must satisfy the age criteria broadly speaking you must be under 24 years when you apply although a maximum of 26 years is allowed in certain clearly defined exceptional circumstances
- You must have completed, or be in the processing of completing, an undergraduate degree with a GPA of 6.75/7 or higher.
- Meet and or exceed the entry requirements for your chosen Oxford course.
- Subject to meeting criteria, if you are unsuccessful in your first application, you may apply a second time.

What the selectors look for

Academic achievement and excellence.

Truth, courage, devotion to duty, sympathy for and protection of the weak, kindliness, unselfishness and fellowship.



Energy to use one's talents to the full as demonstrated by mastery in areas such as sports, music, debate, dance, theatre, and artistic pursuits.

Moral force of character and the instincts to lead and to take an interest in your fellow human beings.



Could you be a John Monash Scholar?

To be eligible to apply you must ...

- Be an Australian citizen
- Have completed (or be about to complete) a degree from an Australian university
- Be planning to undertake postgraduate study at an overseas university commencing in the calendar year following the year of application and selection (it is not necessary to have already been accepted to the institution at the time of applying)
- Be able to argue the merits of the chosen course and institution and how they are best positioned to drive progress in the chosen field of study
- Be able to demonstrate a commitment to leadership for others

Our selection criteria are based on the qualities modelled by General Sir John Monash ...

Excellence

Evidenced through a university degree obtained with outstanding results, or through prizes, awards, publications, performance, exhibitions, enterprises and excellence in professional endeavours


Leadership

Demonstrated leadership experience or potential in the field of study, professional environment and/or the community

Citizenship

About Paul Ramsay


Paul Ramsay AO (1936-2014) was a leading Australian businessman and philanthropist.

The Ramsay Postgraduate Scholarships were established through the generosity of the founder of the Ramsay Centre, Mr Paul Ramsay.

The scholarships support outstanding, thoughtful and imaginative young Australians - our future leaders and critical thinkers - to undertake graduate study overseas.







Scholarship Categories

Our scholarships are some of the most generous currently on offer in Australia.

They support one, two and, in select cases, three years of coursework and/or research.

There are two main types of scholarship available

- 1. World Universities Ramsay
 Postgraduate Scholarship (Value of
 AUD\$90,000 p.a.)
- 2. St John's College, Annapolis, Master of Liberal Arts Scholarship and Washington DC Internship Program (Value of AUD\$75,000 p.a. for two years)

Applicants in both categories will need to be Australian citizens or permanent residents and have secured a place in a relevant graduate program abroad before finalising their application.

Up to 25 scholarships a year may be awarded, with the majority awarded in category 1.





World Universities Scholarship

World Universities Scholarship

The experience of studying abroad at some of the world's most coveted academic institutions is an experience like no other.

Our benefactor Paul Ramsay wanted to support young Australian leaders in their pursuit of this opportunity, so they could realise their goals and make their own unique contribution to Australian society.

Our World Universities Ramsay Postgraduate Scholarship supports young Australians to undertake graduate study at the world's best universities (e.g. Oxford, Cambridge, UCL, Harvard, Princeton, Bologna etc.) for one, two and, in select cases, three years of graduate coursework and/or research.

Levels of support are fully competitive with the Rhodes, John Monash, Fulbright and other major scholarships.

Value: AUD\$90,000 p.a.

The scholarship payment is a contribution towards tuition, living and travel costs associated with postgraduate study. Students applying for the scholarship will need to have secured a place in a graduate program abroad before finalising their application.



Q's and key messages:

1. What makes a compelling application?

- Understand each scholarship, type of support provided and alumni, university options

2. Talking about yourself.

- A convincing "backstory" with evidence of excellence (academic and professional); an exciting "forwardstory."
- Curiosity include the things that make you interesting or different beyond your academic/professional
- Authenticity written from the heart NOT for the panel.

3. Writing about your leadership?

- Leadership is personal and unique to you. Understand your leadership style, who &/or what has shaped your views, & your approach to leading others both formally & informally
- 'Tell a story' about you as a leader, your journey (situation, actions & impact) and what difference you have made. What were the challenges, learning, changes in your approach and impact. Suggest two key examples
- Leadership is about partnerships, community and the people you have worked with

4. Writing a personal statement?

- This is not a CV. It is your story! You need to understand and be able to talk about you! your values, drivers, passions... First, talk about your background where you grew up, the people (parents, community, teachers) and experiences that shape you.
- Then ask yourself "when did things change?" "when did I get serious?" "what experiences shaped me?"
 Finally, the future and what difference you want to make
- Write it 10 or more times and keep thinking about and talking about who you are and why

5. What support can I get & do I need?

- This is hard! Cannot do it on your own. Applications benefit from different perspectives & expertise (e.g. editor)
- Build a squad of people who will support and assist you: Mentors, referees, scholarship alumni, university support, shoulders to cry on, peer reviewers, practice interview panellists.....



A few other points: a strong application is persuasive providing evidence of

- **Passion** for your field, study & personal endeavours
- **Vision** for yourself, the world & your field don't be shy, be ambitious
- **Excellence** demonstrates academic & other achievements
- Innovation of your research and what you plan to do creative, inspired thinking
- Partnerships, collaborations and linkages
- **Ambassadorial skills** your community engagement / involvement you have to be able to articulate all of this
- Personality and Adaptability in applicants looking for rounded people
- **Peer reviewed** get feedback people from outside your discipline Written in simple plain English, appeals to multi-disciplinary panel
