2.0 DONOR OF PRIZE

3.0 NATURE OF PRIZE

3.1 2024 approximately \$300 to be shared equally between vocalist and accompanist

4.0 DURATION OF PRIZE

4.1 The prizes are to be offered on an annual basis

5.0 ELIGIBILITY FOR PRIZE

5.1 Awarded to two full-time Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University classical voice and classical piano students for the best partnership between vocalist and accompanist

6.0 SELECTION PROCESS

- 6.1 Competitors are required to perform:
a. a song by Handel or Purcell
b. a French Melodie sung in the original language, and
c. a German lied sung in the original language
6.2 Judges are to be appointed by the Director or his nominee. No judge may be the teacher of a student who is competing.
6.3 A preliminary round may be held if required.

7.0 ADMINISTRATION OF THE PRIZE

7.1 The Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University will be responsible for the administration of the prize, including the publicising of the prize and managing funds associated with the prize.
