



2025 TCI China Study Tour

Project and Itinerary Introduction

Project Overview

The **2025 TCI China Study Tour** is a two-week immersive program in **Chinese language and culture**, presented by the <u>Tourism Confucius Institute</u> (TCI) at <u>Griffith University</u>, in partnership with the <u>China University of Mining and Technology</u> (CUMT).

Since its launch in 2014, this program has offered Griffith students a good chance to experience China beyond the classroom — through local interactions, cultural workshops, language practice, and visits to world-renowned historical sites.

Ideal for students passionate about the Chinese language, this tour blends hands-on cultural exploration with real-world language application, helping participants build both fluency and intercultural understanding.

Key Objectives

1. Language and Cultural Immersion

Participants will engage in daily **Chinese language practice**, **hands-on cultural workshops**, and **community interactions**, offering a rich, immersive experience that enhances both language proficiency and cultural understanding.

2. Educational and Cultural Exchange

Through visits to partner universities and participation in **peer exchange activities** with Chinese students, the tour promotes **mutual learning**, **global awareness**, and the building of lasting **intercultural friendships**.

3. Historical and Cultural Discovery

The program features guided visits to iconic cities such as **Beijing**, **Suzhou**, **Xuzhou**, and **Qufu**, providing deep insight into China's **ancient traditions**, **cultural heritage**, and evolving modern identity.

Expected Outcomes

By the end of the program, participants will:

- Strengthen practical language skills and cultural competence through real-life immersion and daily interaction.
- Deepen their understanding of Chinese society, history, traditions, and everyday life.





- Build meaningful connections with peers and local communities, enhancing cross-cultural communication and collaboration.
- Experience personal growth by stepping outside their comfort zones and embracing new cultural perspectives.

Itinerary Highlights (Detailed Itinerary will be updated)

Dates: 1-14 November 2025

Day 1-5 (01-05 Nov.): Beijing

- Arrival in Beijing
- Explore iconic cultural landmarks: Forbidden City, Great Wall, Temple of Heaven, and more.
- Participate in **introductory Chinese language sessions** and basic communication practice.
- Experience local cuisine and daily life through guided cultural immersion activities.

Day 6-7 (06-07 Nov.): <u>Suzhou</u>

- Visit Suzhou Museum and UNESCO-listed Classical Gardens.
- Stroll through a traditional water town to experience ancient Chinese lifestyle and architecture.
- Language and culture focus: Traditional Chinese aesthetics and daily expressions.

Day 8-12 (08-12 Nov.): Xuzhou

- Travel to Xuzhou and hotel check-in
- Activities include:
 - Welcome ceremony and orientation
 - Campus tour at local university
 - Chinese language immersion program (daily sessions)
 - Hands-on cultural workshops: paper cutting, calligraphy, martial arts, Chinese painting, tea ceremony
 - o Visits to local museums and historical sites
 - Closing ceremony and group reflection on experiences





- Visit Confucius Temple, Mansion, and Museum
- Participating in cultural exchange activities focused on Confucian heritage and values

Day 14 (14 Nov.): Departure

- Pack and prepare for return travel
- Transfer from Xuzhou to airport for flight back to Brisbane

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for the China Study Tour, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- **TCI Students**: You must be a current or former TCI student. Students who have participated in this program within the past three years are **NOT** eligible.
- University Students in Queensland: You must be currently enrolled at a university in Queensland, either in a Chinese language program or another program with some Chinese language background.
- HSK Certification: You must have completed the HSK Level 1 exam or higher prior to departure. If you have not taken the exam before departure, you will be required to sit for the HSK Level 1 exam during the study tour, as arranged by the program organizers.

Please note: TCI organizes monthly HSK exams at the Nathan and Gold Coast campuses. Please visit the <u>TCI website</u> for exam schedules and registration details.

• Valid Passport: You must hold a passport valid for at least six months beyond the planned departure date.

These criteria are designed to ensure participants are well-prepared to make the most of this valuable cultural experience. We look forward to welcoming you to the program and exploring China together!
