5.1 Awarded to a Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University student completing a Bachelor of Music Degree, majoring in Brass, judged to have performed the best two contrasting works in this public competition.

6.0 SELECTION PROCESS

6.1 The award of the Prizes shall be determined at a public competition to be held annually.

6.2 Judges will be appointed by the Director.

6.3 Each entrant is required to present a program of two contrasting works, not exceeding 15 minutes in total.

6.4 The cost of the accompanist will be borne by the entrant.

6.5 Previous winners are not eligible to apply.

6.6 No judge may be the teacher of a student who is competing.

7.0 ADMINISTRATION OF THE PRIZE

7.1 The Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University will be responsible for the administration of this Prize.
