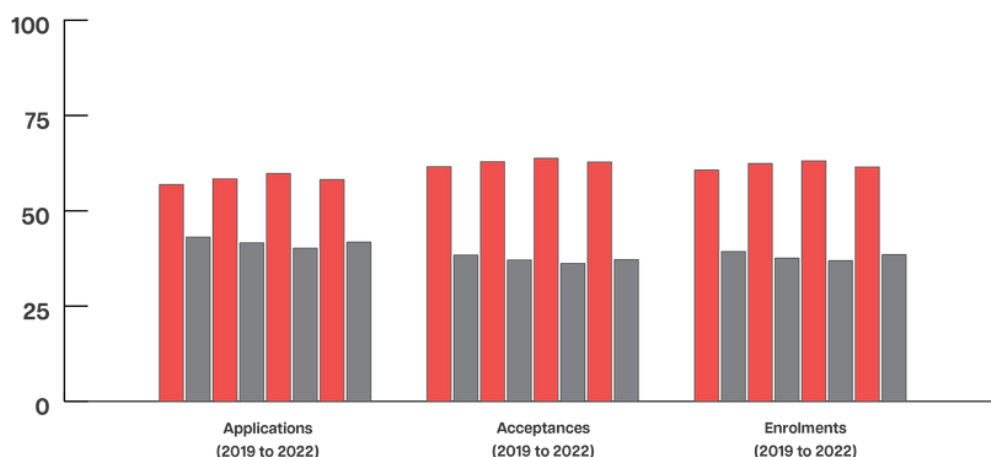

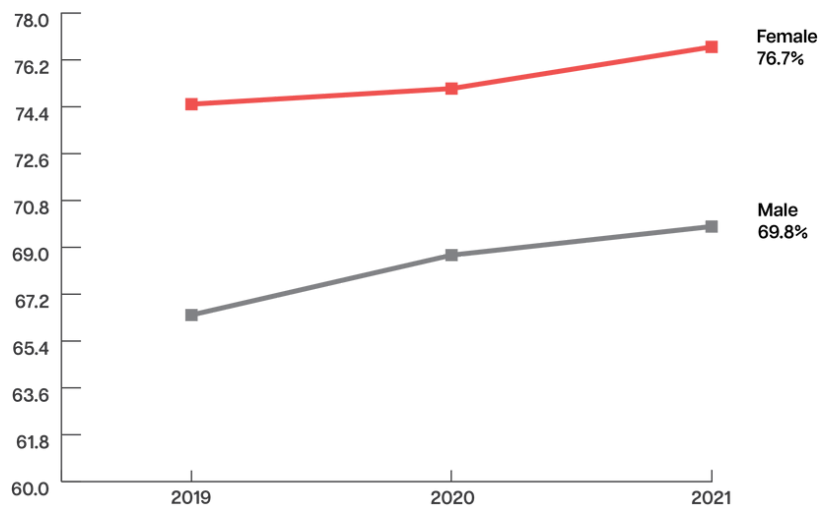


- Women have been the majority of applications, acceptance and enrolments since 2019.
- In 2022, enrolment by women was lowest in the Science group (36.2%) and highest in the Health Group (72.7%). Business had an even distribution, with 51% women. In Arts, Education and Law, 68.4% of students were women.
