6.2 Candidates are to perform **2 contrasting pieces** not exceeding a total of 10 minutes in duration

6.3 Candidates are required to provide their own accompanist

6.4 Application forms will be available on the Scholarships Noticeboard

6.5 Late entries will not be accepted

6.6 Order of appearance will be drawn with accompanists grouped together then in alphabetical order and published on the Scholarships noticeboard

6.7 Adjudicators to be appointed with the approval of the Director – **no adjudicator may be the teacher of a student who is competing.**

6.8 Previous winners of this prize are ineligible to enter
