FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What kind of project can I undertake?

Volunteers can participate in work on research projects and/or Coastal and Marine Research Centre community engagement programs such as <u>Coast Ed</u>.

You are welcome to approach one of our Researchers or Teams about developing a tailored project.

Is this a paid position?

Volunteer opportunities at the Coastal and Marine Research Centre are unpaid appointments.

Am I covered by insurance?

Griffith University insurance policies do not recognise volunteers under our travel and/or liability premiums.

Volunteers must ensure that their home organisation provides an appropriate level of cover for their time at Griffith. Please ensure that information regarding these premiums is provided as part of your application.

What should I bring?

Speak to your supervisor about the requirements of your project.

The Coastal and Marine Research Centre will provide you with a desk space, University email account/ system login and internet access. Speak to your supervisor if you require specific equipment or software for your work.

Volunteers are strongly advised to bring their own laptops for projects involving a lot of computer work. A university computer may be allocated if available, but this cannot be guaranteed.

Can I use my own vehicle?

You are not permitted to use your own vehicle for field work. Please meet on campus and travel to the location with a staff member, using a University vehicle. Public transport may be used in some cases.

Where can I park?

For information about parking on campus, please visit the Parking at Griffith webpage.

Where can I stay while working?

Volunteers are expected to arrange their own accommodation.

Griffith University offers a number of on-campus, homestay and partnered accommodation services. For more information, visit the <u>Accommodation webpage</u>. Please note that some of these services do not offer short-stay (under 6 month) arrangements and may only be available to students enrolled directly through the University. The Griffith <u>Student Guild</u> also provides <u>listings of available shared and private accommodation</u> <u>options</u>, in addition to being an excellent resource for finding activities and community groups.

If needed, you can contact local motel or hostel/ backpackers' accommodation in Southport as a temporary measure until something more permanent is found.

I'm coming from overseas

International volunteers are strongly advised to arrange an <u>Australian SIM card and mobile phone plan</u> in order to make and receive calls while in Australia.
