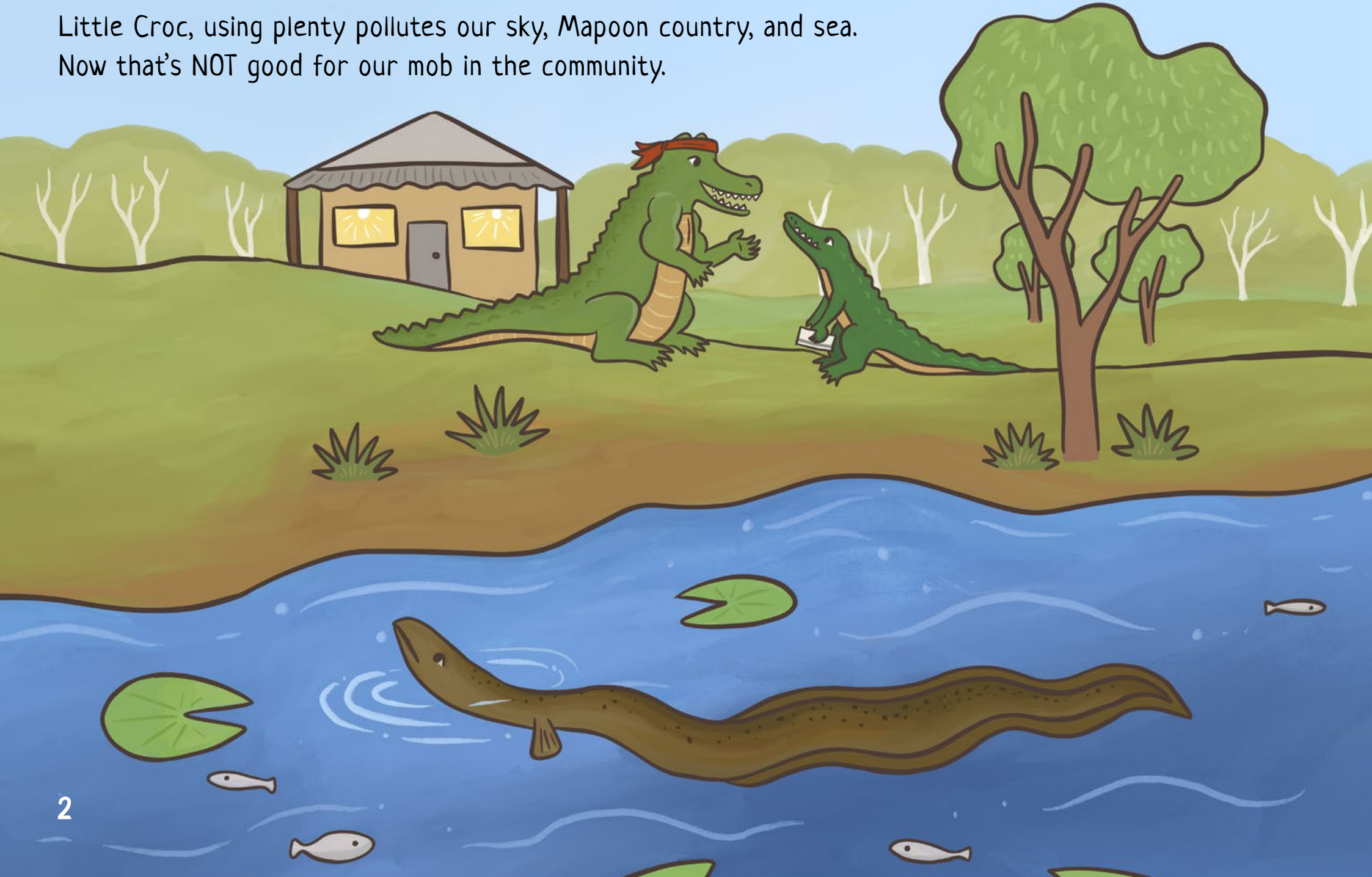

Now that's NOT good for our mob in the community.





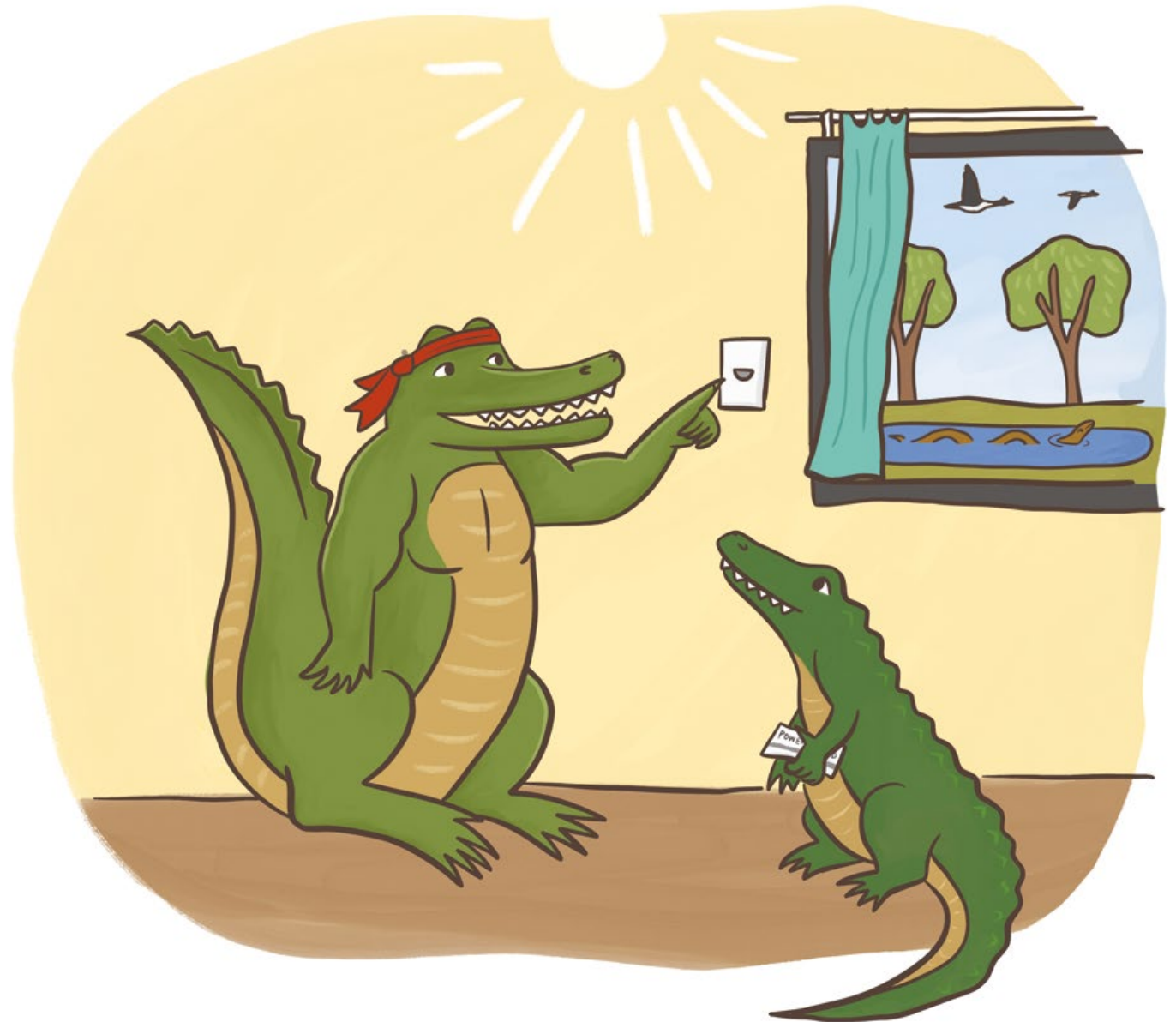
You know when you use plenty, our house is lit up like a Christmas tree.

The Elders say, turning the lights off during the day is the proper way.

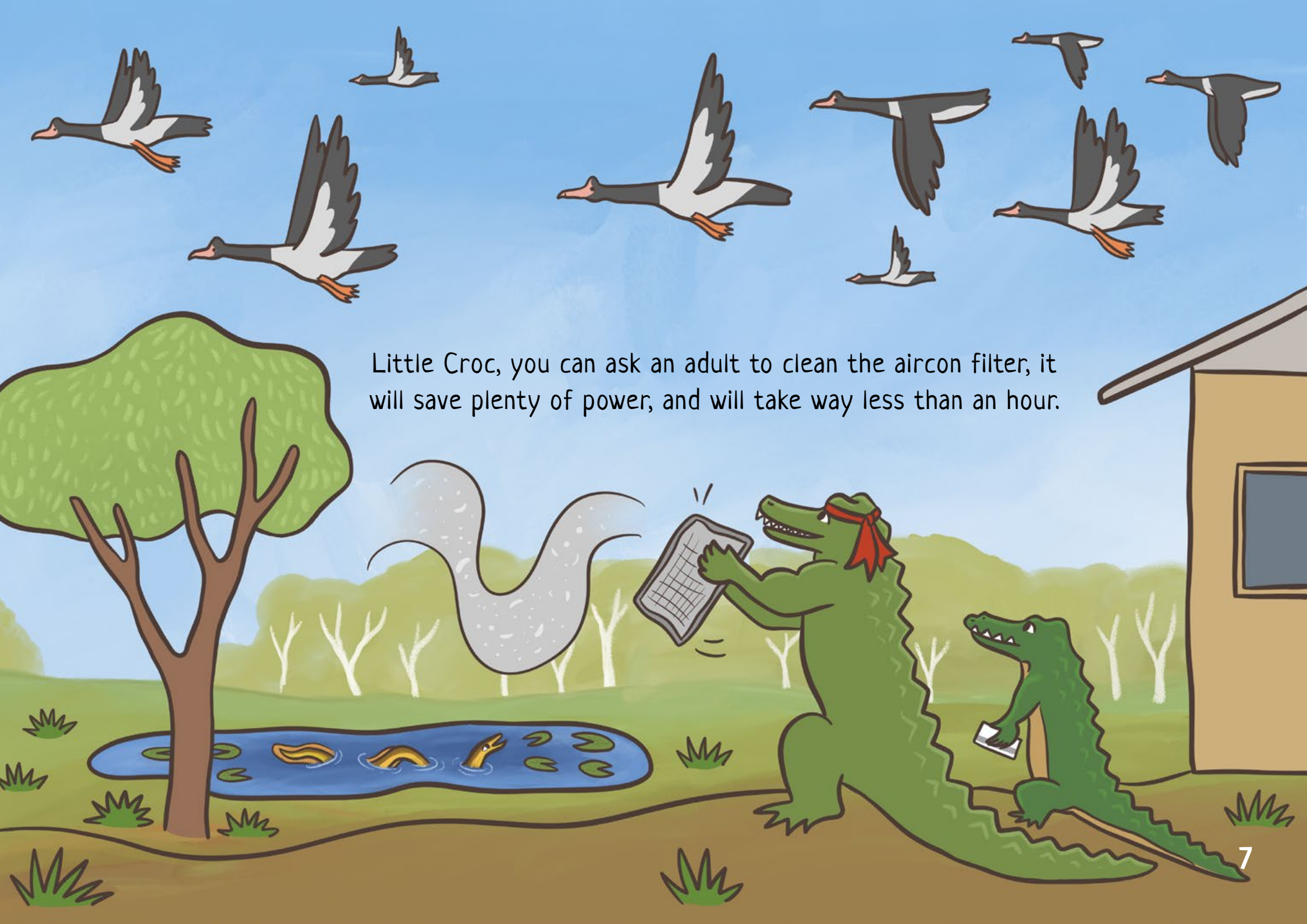


Little Croc, when you go to leave your place, turn the aircon off so the cool air doesn't go to waste.

And turn the aircon off if it's not very hot, on the powercard they cost a lot.

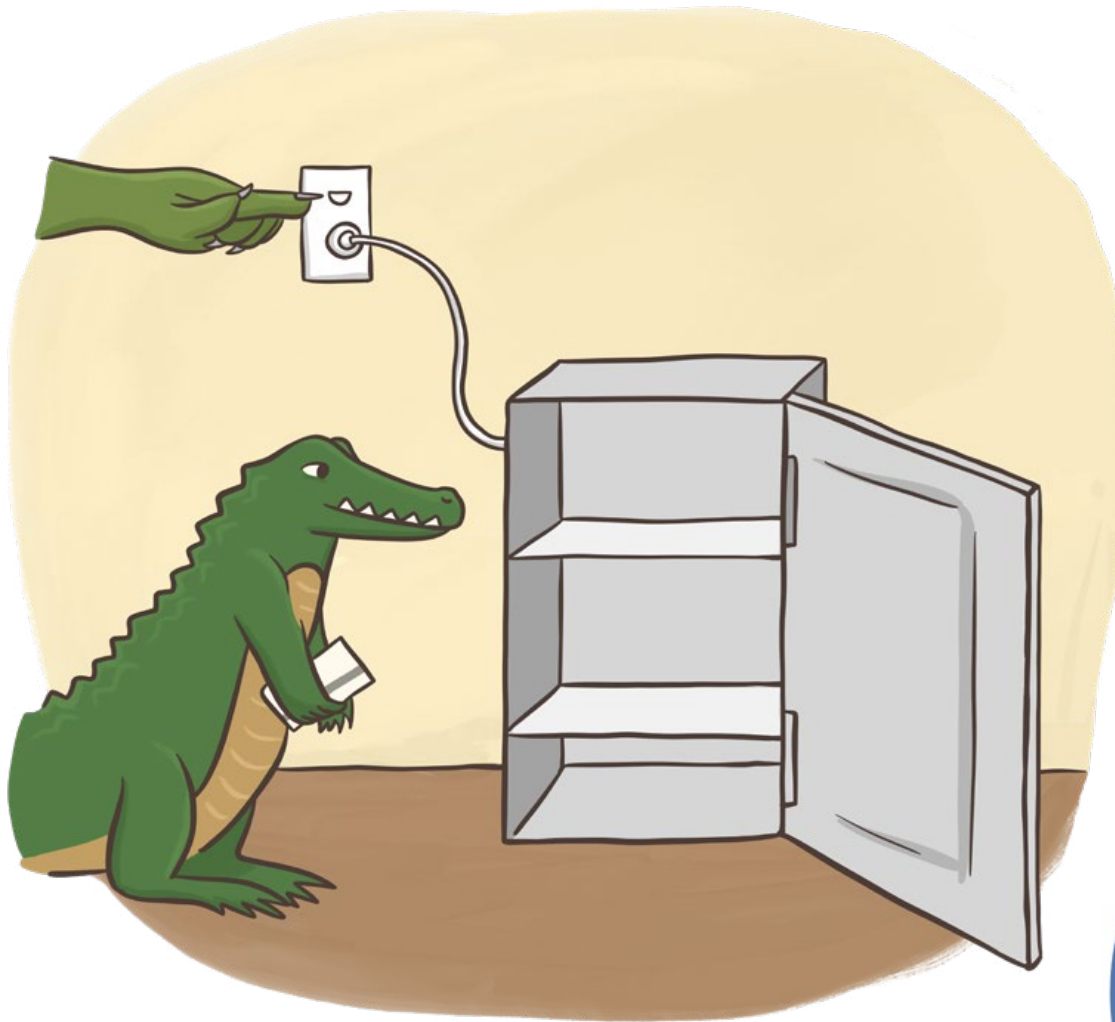


Little Croc, don't run the aircon super cold in the household. Temperature 24 is the best score. Or first use the big fan, little man.

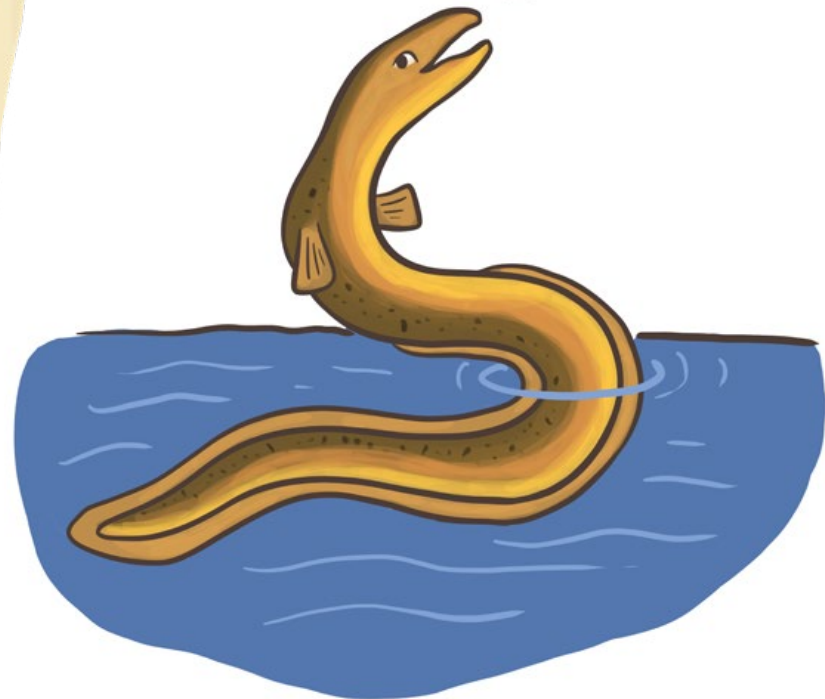


Little Croc, you can ask an adult to clean the aircon filter, it will save plenty of power, and will take way less than an hour.

Little Croc, if the spare fridge and freezer are always empty, they use a lot of electricity and on the power card they cost plenty.



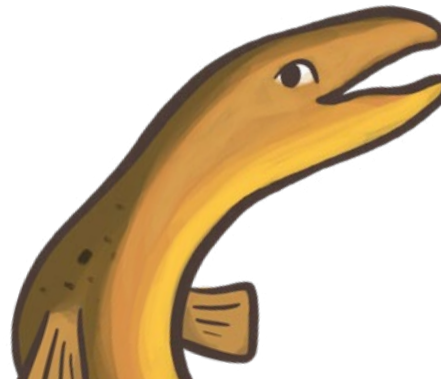
If you don't use your spare fridge and freezer, turn them off to save on your power card.
