4.1 The Prize will be offered and reviewed annually.

5.0 ELIGIBILITY FOR PRIZE

5.1 Awarded to a Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University undergraduate student completing a Bachelor of Music Degree, completing elective studies in Performance (Brass Instruments) (Classical)
 The applicant may not have received the first prize award in previous years

6.0 SELECTION PROCESS

- 6.1 The prizes will be awarded for excellence in performance
- 6.2 The award of the Prizes shall be determined at a public competition to be held annually
- 6.3 Each entrant is required to present a program of two contrasting works, not exceeding 15 minutes in total.
- 6.4 The cost of the accompanist will be borne by the entrant.
- 6.5 Previous first prize winners are not eligible to apply.
- 6.6 A judging panel of three comprising the Director of QCGU (or their delegate), Head of Brass Studies (or their delegate) and one independent industry member of repute.
- 6.7 No judge may be the teacher of a student who is competing.

7.0 ADMINISTRATION OF THE PRIZE

7.1 The Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University will be responsible for the administration of this Prize.
