Greater access to online materials

Access Plus is a new automated service for the conversion of documents to a range of formats to assist people with print disabilities.

You can use Access Plus to convert documents into a range of alternative formats including digital Braille, MP3, DAISY and e-books. The service can also be used to convert otherwise inaccessible documents such as image-only PDF files or scanned images into more accessible formats.

*(NOTE: If you are registered with Disabilities Service for print disabilities we will already be supporting conversion of your **required** learning materials).*

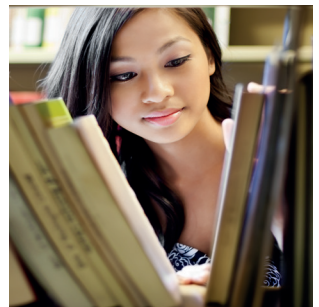
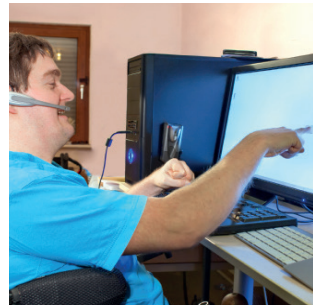
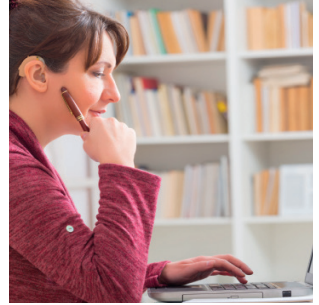
How to access to this site?
