PURPOSE	The Graduate Certificate qualifies individuals who apply a body of knowledge in a range of contexts to undertake professional/highly skille and as a pathway for further learning.	
KNOWLEDGE	Graduates of a Graduate Certificate will have specialised knowledge within a systematic and coherent body of knowledge that may include the acquisition and application of knowledge and skills in a new or existing discipline or professional area	The Graduate Certificate in First Peoples Community Practice provides integrated theoretical and practical knowledge which provides graduates with the foundation for ethical, anti-colonial and collaborative practice with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander individuals, communities and community-run organisations.
SKILLS	<ul> <li>Graduates of a Graduate Certificate will have:</li> <li>cognitive skills to review, analyse, consolidate and synthesise knowledge and identify and provide solutions to complex problems</li> <li>cognitive skills to think critically and to generate and evaluate complex ideas</li> <li>specialised technical and creative skills in a field of highly skilled and/or professional practice</li> <li>communication skills to transfer complex knowledge and ideas to a variety of audiences</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Graduates of the Graduate Certificate in First Peoples Community Practice will have:</li> <li>knowledge of the broad areas of First Peoples community practice relevant to practice and theory as well as their ability to apply this theory in professional contexts.</li> <li>effective communication as a core skill and a key component in the provision of services to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.</li> <li>an understanding of how to communicate with others from a diverse range of backgrounds and in different contexts.</li> <li>advanced inter-professional communication in the workplace via work-integrated learning opportunities.</li> </ul>
